Topic: “The Evolving Role of Dental Hygienists: Regulation and Progress on the Code of Professional Discipline”

He is currently the Chairperson of the Dental Council of Hong Kong.

Dr Johnson Zhang earned his Bachelor of Dental Surgery (BDS, 2008) and Master of Dental Surgery in Periodontology (MDS (Perio), 2012) from The University of Hong Kong. He is a current member of the Dental Council of Hong Kong (DCHK) and serves on its Education Accreditation Committee. A former member of the DCHK Examination Committee, he chairs the Task Force on revision of the Code of Professional Discipline (COP), which develops the draft Code of Professional Discipline for dental hygienists for subsequent review and revision by the Council and relevant stakeholders. Dr Zhang has been a Council Member of the Hong Kong Dental Association (HKDA) since 2016 and Co-Chairman of its Mainland Affairs Committee.



Abstract: In the context of evolving roles for dental hygienists in Hong Kong, this joint presentation provides background context, regulatory perspectives and practical guidance on the Code of Professional Discipline. Dr Raymond Lee, MH, JP, Chairperson of the Dental Council of Hong Kong, will outline statutory and regulatory perspectives from the Council. Dr Johnson Zhang, Chair of the Task Force responsible for preparing the Code for Dental Hygienists for the Council's approval, will explain its core provisions and key policy rationales. The session will cover professional standards, expected conduct, professional boundaries, and risk-management considerations for supervising dentists. Designed to equip HKDA members with a clear understanding of the updated regulatory framework, the presentation will include an audience Q&A to address operational and compliance-related enquiries.



Lecture II (8:30 pm – 10:00 pm)

Topic: “Rescue the Impacted Maxillary Canine: Strategies for Early Detection and Interceptive Management”

Dr Sum began his orthodontic training after graduating with a Bachelor of Dental Surgery (BDS) from The University of Hong Kong (HKU) in 2013. He further earned the Fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons (FRACDS (GDP)) in 2018, followed by a Master of Dental Surgery (MDS) in 2020 and an Advanced Diploma in Orthodontics in 2022, both from HKU.



Dr Sum holds fellowships with the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine, the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong and the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons.

Currently, Dr Sum practices in the private sector while holding teaching positions at the Faculty of Dentistry, HKU, and an honorary appointment with the Department of Dentistry and Maxillofacial Surgery at the United Christian Hospital (UCH). At the university, he is actively involved in undergraduate and postgraduate orthodontic education. At UCH, he provides specialised orthodontic treatment for patients with syndromic conditions, cleft lip and palate, and obstructive sleep apnoea.

Abstract: Impacted maxillary canines are a common clinical challenge in orthodontics and oral surgery, ranking second only to third molars in frequency of impaction. Clinicians should begin assessing the maxillary canine position as early as 8–9 years of age, since interceptive treatment can be successfully carried out if the condition is identified early. Early detection enables simpler interventions, such as extracting retained primary canines or performing arch expansion. This presentation explores the etiology, diagnosis, and management of impacted maxillary canines, supported by current literature. Additionally, we will examine the role of early intervention through different interceptive treatments options, as well as the potential consequences of untreated impacted canines. By integrating case examples and evidence-based insights, this presentation aims to equip clinicians with practical strategies to optimize the treatment outcomes when managing impacted maxillary canines.
